SYLLABUS – HEALTH LAW PRACTICUM Fall Semester – 2010 Hamline University School of Law

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CLASS SCHEDULE

There will be six classroom meetings for the Health Law Practicum. All classes will take place on Mondays from 2:00pm to3:50pm in Room 240A with the exception of the first class. All Practicum students must attend this first meeting which will take place during the week of August 23, 2010. Specific date, time and location to be announced.

You are expected to meet with your mentor no later than August 31, 2010 to properly introduce yourself, discuss academic expectations of the Health Law Practicum, develop a preliminary schedule for your work hours, answer any questions your mentor may have about the practicum, and articulate several specific experiences that you hope to have during your practicum. Please email me after you have had this initial meeting.

Classroom meetings are devoted to discussing student experiences while working with hosting organizations, and the discussion of issues relating to health law in general. Each week students will be expected to reflect on an issue addressed in the practicum setting. Additionally, each student will be expected to make a brief presentation on a health related issue identified in the field. More details to come. Class will be held on the following dates:

- Sept. 13: Organizational Structure and Governance/Confidentiality/HIPAA
 - o Come to class prepared to discuss the organizational structure and governance of your hosting organization.
 - Come to class prepared to discuss the confidentiality policies of your hosting organization.
 - o Familiarize yourself with HIPAA. Is your hosting organization a "covered entity" or a "business associate"?
- Sept. 27: Conflicts of Interest/Regulatory Infrastructure
 - Come to class prepared to discuss your hosting organization's conflict of interest policy/policies.
 - Come to class prepared to discuss how your hosting organization interfaces with the health care regulatory infrastructure.
- Oct. 18: Alternative Dispute Resolution in Health Care
 - o Come to class prepared to discuss your hosting organization's experience with alternative dispute resolution.
- Oct. 25: Presentations More information to come.
- Nov. 8: Career Planning/Reflections
