REGISTRATION INFORMATION

COURSE REQUIREMENTS

Students must attend all class sessions and complete an advance reading assignment. Degree-seeking students must submit a written paper or complete an exam. Students may take one or more courses. No course has a prerequisite.

COURSE MATERIALS

All courses require completion of a reading assignment prior to the first class meeting. Syllabi for all courses will be made available the first week of May and will include a list of the text/course materials which students will need to purchase for each course. The advance reading assignment will be provided prior to the start of each course.

REGISTRATION

Law and Graduate Students: Degree-seeking students currently enrolled in an ABA accredited law school or graduate program should complete Part A of the application form and return it with a letter from his or her school's registrar reflecting the applicant's status as a student in good standing with permission to take the Hamline course(s) as a visiting student.

Attorneys: Attorneys may apply to audit summer courses by completing Part B of the application form. Attorneys will be granted special student status. CLE credits will be granted upon completion of each course.

Others: Other professionals may apply to take summer courses by completing Part C of the application form. To be considered, applicants must furnish a transcript indicating completion of an undergraduate or graduate degree.

TUITION

Tuition for degree-seeking students is \$1,190 per credit. This includes both students seeking credit for a graduate degree and those seeking credits to complete the Health Care Compliance Certificate Program for JD credit.

Tuition for attorneys and health care professionals (audit students) is \$550 per credit.

A \$150 per course, non-refundable tuition deposit must accompany all applications. The tuition deposit will be deducted from the total tuition amount. This deposit will only be returned if the applicant is not accepted into the course. *The balance of the tuition is due one week prior to the beginning class session for each course after which no refund will be made.*

Applications are accepted on a first-come/first-registered basis. Students will receive confirmation of enrollment via email. Hamline University School of Law reserves the right to cancel any course that does not meet minimum enrollment requirements.

This is an intensive two week, three credit course taught by compliance industry leaders designed to deliver the tools necessary for working professionals and students to enhance job performance and become more competitive in the compliance job market. During the course students will gain a more sophisticated understanding of the law and regulations encountered by compliance professionals in daily practice, develop the skills to conduct audits and investigations, and learn how to manage employee and vendor issues including enforcement and reporting requirements.

This course examines a number of legal, ethical, and social issues raised by our nation's growing elder population. Special attention is given to: (i) elder abuse, neglect, and financial exploitation; (ii) the licensing, certification, accreditation, and general regulation of health care and housing providers; (iii) end-of-life issues, including senior settlements, health care directives, surrogacy, and physician-assisted suicide; (iv) guardianship and conservatorship; (v) financial planning for retirement; (vi) managing and paying for health care, including Medicaid, Medicare, long-term care insurance, and health care reform issues; (vii) property management, including durable powers of attorney for property, joint ownership and financial accounts, trusts, and estate planning; (viii) age discrimination; (ix) ethical issues in elder representation; and (x) other family issues, including "grandparents as parents," grandchild visitation, and later marriages and re-marriages.

(Un)Healthy Choices: Tobacco, Obesity, and Beyond

Should states tax junk foods? Should food stamps be redeemable at fast food restaurants? Can states ban smoking outside? In public housing? Should frozen cheese pizza count as a serving of vegetables in school lunch programs? Can the FDA require tobacco companies to display disturbing pictures as graphic warning labels on cigarette packages? These types of questions pervade public debate today, raising questions about the balance of powers between federal and state governments, the proper scope of individual liberties and market freedoms, and the value of paternalistic policies compared to a focus on personal choice and responsibility.

In this class, we will focus on public health responses to noncommunicable diseases, primarily using tobacco control and obesity-reduction measures as case studies. We will evaluate the daunting domestic and global health burden of noncommunicable diseases, look at the relationships between choices and environments in fueling the spread of noncommunicable diseases, and examine legal tools for addressing the tobacco and obesity epidemics. In doing so, we will also explore legal barriers, ethical objections, and popular resistance to public health policies targeting noncommunicable diseases.

Health Reform: Insurance Plans, Exchanges, and Mandates

Qualifies for 12 CLE credits

The Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act of 2010 (the Act) made sweeping changes to group health plans and individual health insurance coverage, beginning with immediate reforms of eligibility, benefits and allowable plan designs. This course will begin with an overview of the regulatory scheme prior to the passage of the Act, including the Employee Retirement Income Security Act (ERISA) and the Public Health Services Act (PHSA). The focus will then be on Title I of the Act (Quality, Affordable Health Care For All Americans), examining the mechanics of the passage of this law, the grandfather provisions, immediate reforms that are already in effect and the major market shift that will take place in the next few years culminating with the Exchange in 2014. Finally, in the most controversial health care law case in recent history, the Supreme Court is being asked to review the Act and we will conclude the course with a review of the constitutional challenges to the Act and the severability of the individual coverage mandate.

The Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act of 2010 (the Act) significantly enhances the federal government's efforts to combat fraud, waste and abuse with respect to Medicare, Medicaid and other federally funded health care programs. This course will examine the Act's "Transparency and Program Integrity" provisions, which are designed to enhance the government's enforcement efforts.
