While the primary focus of the presentation or paper need not be Minnesota-specific, please explain the regional relevance of your topic and thesis.

**REVIEW PROCEDURE:** A committee will review the abstracts and will invite applicants to speak at the symposium and/or publish in the *Hamline Law Review*. The committee will base invitations on the relevance, quality and originality of the abstract. Potential symposium speakers include both scholars and practitioners in law, medicine, and other disciplines.

**TRAVEL:** Symposium contributors will be provided with both travel and accommodation expenses, as well as with a modest stipend.
