Goals and Objectives: This course is intended to introduce students to the art of drafting the various estate planning documents available today. Discussion points will include the specific components of several types of documents, variations on the available standard forms, and numerous examples of poor lawyering in this area. Some attention will also be given to drafting related documents such as powers of attorney and health care directives.

Attendance Policy: Attendance will be taken at the beginning of each class. Because there are only two class sessions, absence from any portion of any session will be deemed grossly excessive, and will result in the removal of the student from the class. The decision whether such student will receive a "W" or an "F" grade for the class rests solely with the Associate Dean and not with Professor Goldman.
